Anchor Institutions

Anchor institutions are defined by their link to a place and are invested in the long-term development and health of their local areas. This includes organisations with their local geography as part of their identity or with responsibility for significant infrastructure, such as hospitals, universities, councils or large local businesses.

Based on the 5 recognised anchor pillars, the Anchor Framework has a set of priorities and principles that organisations are asked to commit to deliver - providing opportunity, real living wage, and achieving net zero'
