We would therefore like to a reach out and ask if the product (Aciclover Agepha Eye Ointment 3%) is available in the formulary and if not what's the procedural inclusion steps into the formulary, which will allow healthcare professionals to prescribe Aciclovir.

## **Our Response:**

Please note from 01 July 2022, Clinical Commissioning Groups (CCGs) were disestablished, and their statutory functions and responsibilities inherited by NHS Cheshire and Merseyside ICB. As a result, NHS Cheshire & Merseyside ICB has inherited the two former formularies in operation by the former CCGs, which are the Pan Mersey Formulary and the Cheshire Formulary. Please find listed below the formulary status of Aciclover Agepha Eye Ointment 3% on both of those formularies:

## **Cheshire Formulary**
