1) Am I right in assuming that GP practices nationwide have been encouraged to appoint Clinical Pharmacist Grade at practice level to monitor prescribing practices.

Our Response:

1) Clinical Pharmacists are one of many additional roles available to be recruited to support GP Practices on a Primary Care Network (PCN) footprint across Cheshire & Merseyside via the Additional Roles Reimbursement Scheme (ARRS). Some member GP Practices may also choose to employ their own Clinical Pharmacist as a member of the GP Practice Team.

Your Request:

2) If it is true as part of NHS initiative at national level, was there a wider consultation either at national or local level with the public or patient forums.

Our Response:

2) NHS Cheshire & Merseyside ICB does not hold this information. Any public and/or patient consultation regarding the use of Clinical Pharmacists in GP Practices would be initiated nationally by NHS England, or locally by the GP Practice and/or the PCN.

3) Is there a clear protocol/guidance within each practice as to what the new health care member is allowed to do and how best to communicate with the patient in advance of either removing a previously prescribed medicine or limit its future dispensing

Our Response:

4) Do they have a clinical role other than reviewing the GP/nurse clinician's prescribing practices and are they allowed to deny specific medicines being repeated with having no direct clinical input in the medical management of the patient concerned

5) Are they able to access confidential medical information about the patients with whom they have no direct dealings by way of scanning through hospital reports and others without explicit consent being given by the patients

6) As I said earlier introduction of clinical pharmacist at practice level is hindering patient access to the GP or Nurse Clinician, while there is vagueness of their true role in patient's clinical management
